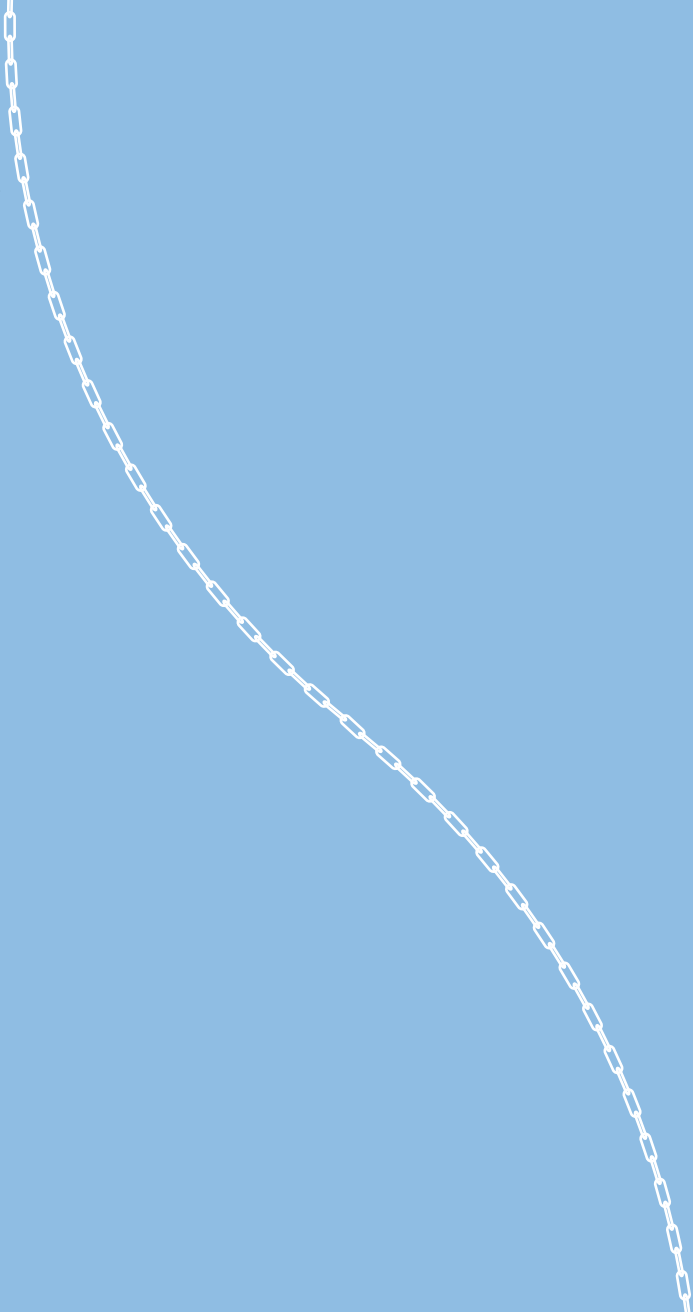

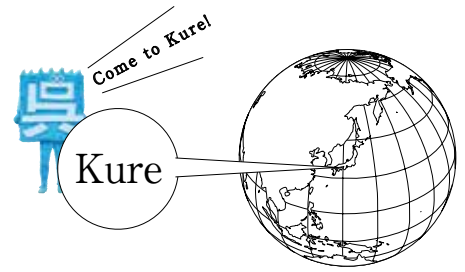

Various traditions have been handed down from ancient times. Delicious food.

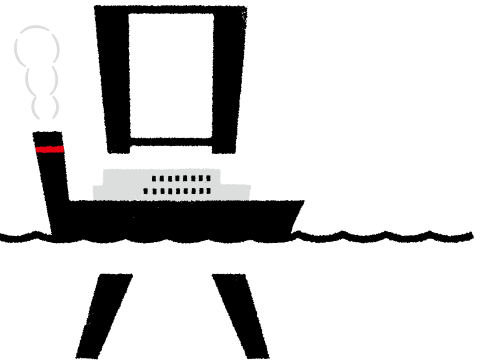
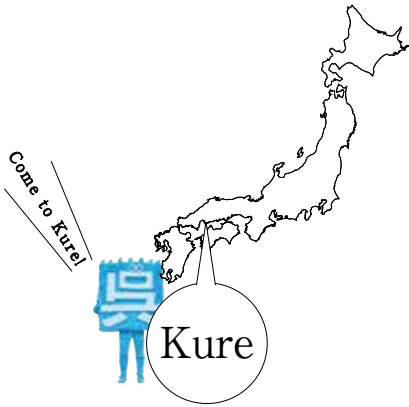

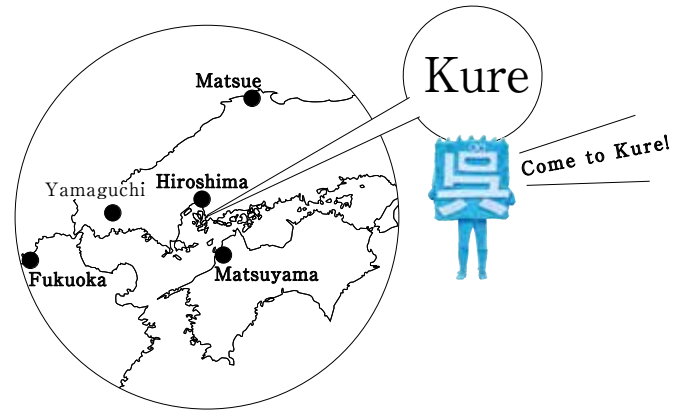

The only museum in Japan that displays a real submarine out of water. In addition to the submarine that is open to the public, the history of the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF) and minesweeper activities are also on display.

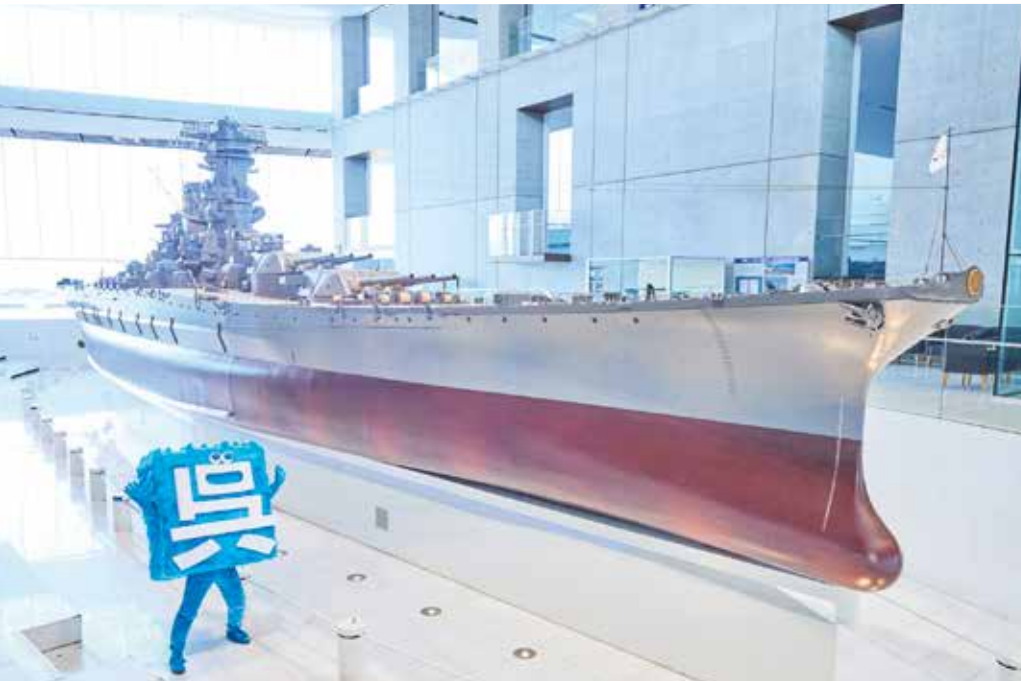

Yushio-Type Submarine “Akishio”

Length: 76.2m (about the size of a jumbo jet)
Weight: 2,250 tons
● Launched in 1986, and decommissioned in March, 2004.

Yamato Museum (Kure Maritime Museum)



The world's largest battleship "Yamato" which was built in Kure has been re-created at 1/10 scale and is displayed at the museum, along with other large items such as a "Zero Fighter" and a human torpedo "Kaiten." The history of Kure developed along with the modernization of Japan, and the science and technology of shipbuilding and steelmaking that supported its history have been handed down to the present day.

Alley Karasu Kojima

It's rare in this world to see submarines up close, but you can do that in this park. Brick buildings from the former naval arsenal can be seen in the surrounding area, giving the park an old fashioned atmosphere.

JMSDF naval vessel open to the public

At JMSDF Kure Naval Base, one naval vessel is open to the public every 1st and 3rd Sunday. A different naval vessel is chosen every week so you can enjoy visiting many times. (*You may take photos outside the naval vessel. Advance reservation required. For more information, go to the official website of Maritime Self-Defense Force Kure District.)

Walk through the town of Kure, which still retains vestiges of the former times when it flourished as a naval port.

KURE CITY CENTRAL AREA

8th Commanding Officer of the Kure Naval Station Tomosaburo Kato Bronze Sculpture

Tomosaburo Kato was a naval soldier and a native of Hiroshima Prefecture. From 1909 (Meiji 42) to 1913 (Taisho 2), he arrived at Kure to take up his post as the commanding officer of the Kure Naval Station. In 1922 (Taisho 11), he was the first Hiroshima native to be inaugurated as Japan's Prime Minister. At the Washington Conference, he stressed the importance of national defense through diplomacy. He actively supported disarmament and was highly praised both in and out of Japan.

In honor of his achievements, there is a bronze statue of him erected in front of the former official residence of the commanding officer of the Kure Naval Station (in the Irifuneyama Memorial Museum).



Irifuneyama Memorial Museum



The former official residence of the Kure Naval Station Admiral, a National Important Cultural Property, is located inside the museum. It was restored as it had been in 1905 based on the original documents found recently. Its walls and the European-style ceilings of the building are covered and decorated with "Kinkarakami" (Japanese gilded embossed paper), which are worth looking at. The former Naval Arsenal Tower Clock was constructed inside the former Naval Base in 1921, and kept its time till the end of the war together with Kure Base.

It is the oldest electric parent-and-child system clock still working in Japan. The melody coming out from the tower four times a day was composed by elementary and junior high school students in Kure.

Ginkgo Connected to Fleet Admiral Togo

A ginkgo seedling was gifted from the Japanese government to the United Kingdom in the 1870s and was planted in Pembroke. Locally, over the years it has been known locally as "Fleet Admiral Togo's Ginkgo Tree." As part of a homecoming project by local Kure residents, a cuttage seedling of the ginkgo in Pembroke was planted in Irifuneyama Park (beside the former detached room of the residence of Fleet Admiral Togo) in 2020.

Former Kure Navy Petty Officers Assembly Hall (Aoyama Club)



The Aoyama Club was established in 1903 as a recreational facility "Kure Navy Petty Officers Assembly Hall (Kure Kaigun Kashisotsu Shukaijo)" which included entertainment and socializing for petty officers and sailors. It was renamed as the "Kure Navy Petty Officers Assembly Hall (Kure Kaigun Kashikanhei Shukaijo)" in 1921. In 1936, it underwent a large scale reconstruction. With a reinforced concrete structure, it took on its modern, present form. During the war it became well known as a social place for the Navy and ordinary citizens to connect.

After the war, the building was used as "Kure House" until the withdrawal of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in 1956. The Maritime Self-Defense Force used it as a recreational facility after the BCOF's withdrawal. However all uses were ended in 2017. At present you can still see the exterior of the building.

Bijutsukan-Dori Street and Kure Municipal Museum of Art

This street lined with pine trees heals the hearts of people who walk it. Bijutsukan-Dori Street has been chosen as one of "Japan's 100 best streets." The "Kure Municipal Museum of Art" lies at the end of this gently sloping street. The museum collects and displays various masterpieces from Japan and overseas.

Battleship Yamato is also hidden here!

This popular secret spot is located on Bijutsukan-Dori Street and the road in front of the Former Navy Cemetery (the main gate of Nagasako Elementary School). Let's find manhole covers that depict the Battleship Yamato!



Hill Overlooking History

From here you can take an overall view from the Historical dock site where the battleship Yamato was constructed to the former Kure Naval Arsenal Shipyards which symbolize the history of Kure after the Meiji period. Also the Shiki Haiku Memorial Stone (Hototogisu Kuhi), and the Great "Ah" Battleship Yamato Monument are located on the hill.

A representative brick building of Kure, completed in 1907. The combination of bricks and granite strikes a beautiful color contrast. Open to the public every 1st and 3rd Sunday.

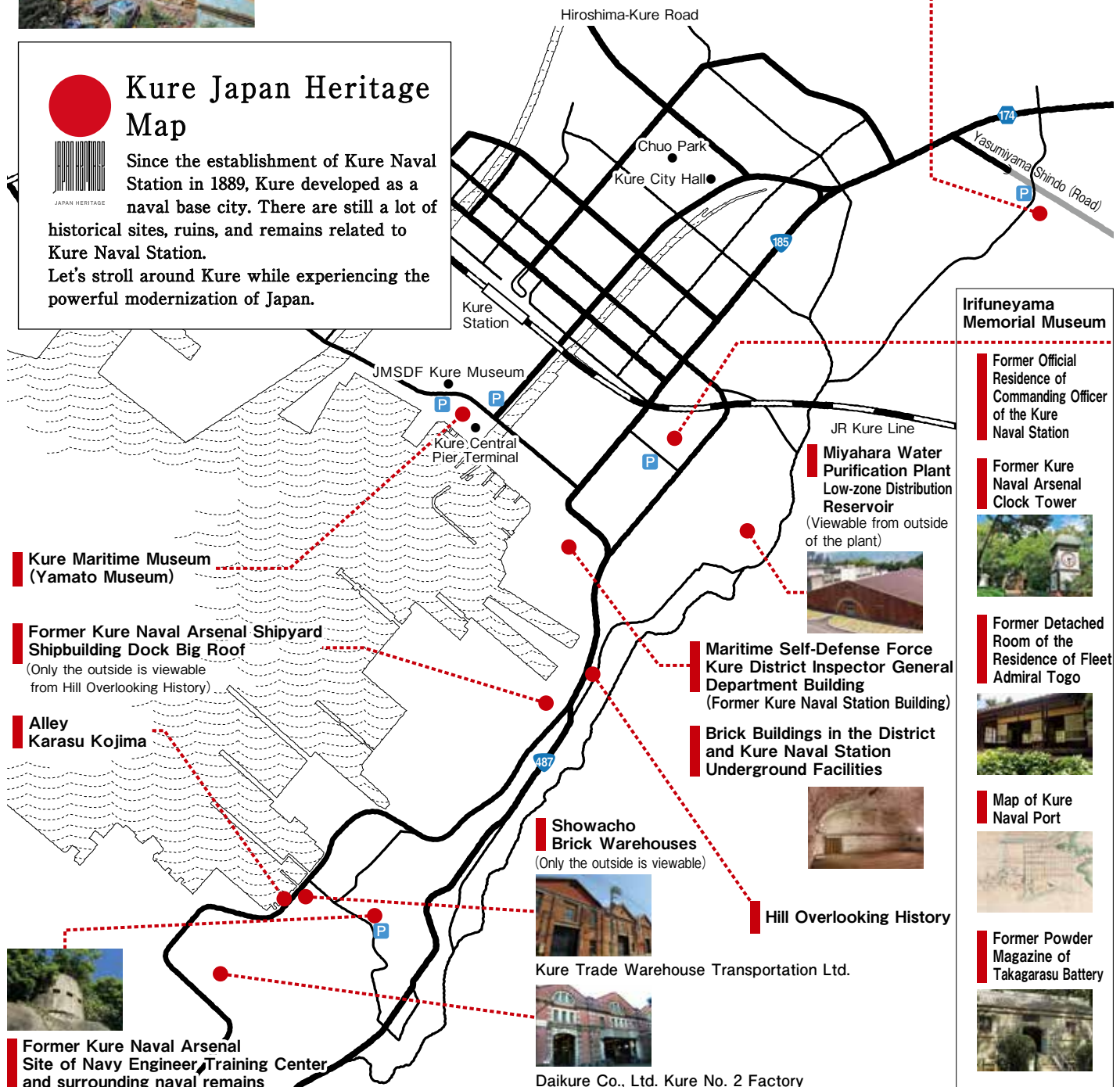
Kure Japan Heritage Map

Food Stalls of Kuramoto Street

This is a unique street in Japan where electricity as well as water and sewer services are provided for food stalls.

You can visit the street at night and enjoy food at old but fashionable stalls that offer creative cuisine.

Nagasako Park (Former Naval Cemetery)



Established in 1890 as a cemetery for naval personnel.

There are many memorial monuments including a monument for the war dead of the battleship Yamato.

- At Kure Station Bus Terminal, take "Naganoki Nagasako Line" bus and get off at "Nagasako-cho."

Mt. Haigamine

At 737m above sea level, you can enjoy a 360-degree grand panoramic view from the observatory. The beautiful night view of the port town is known as one of the best three views in the Chugoku-Shikoku region. This is a romantic spot where it is said that couples who can find the lines of lights that look like the letters "Kure" will get married.

Japan Coast Guard Academy Brick Hall Japan Coast Guard Museum



The Brick Hall is a brick building that was constructed in 1914 as a pyrotechnics factory machine room of the Kure Navy Arsenal. It is a valuable building that, as the "First Factory for the Navy," supported the modernization of Japan and conveyed the spirit of the times. In the Japan Coast Guard Museum which is within the premises, you can learn about the history of Kure which has protected Japan's seas. (*The Japan Coast Guard Museum is available for visits. Reservations required. For details, please see the website <http://www.jcga.ac.jp>)

Remembering Suzu from the Manga "In This Corner of the World."

This is one of the locations for the Manga "In This Corner of the World," which depicted Kure during the Second World War. This is the place where the heroine Suzu walked in front of a storehouse.

The storehouse Mitsugura in the old Sawahara family residence was established in 1809.

It was uniquely built using both straw walls and plaster walls, and it has been designated as an Important Cultural Property.

【The old Sawahara family residence (Mitsugura)】

This place is a model of the house where the heroine Suzu lived.

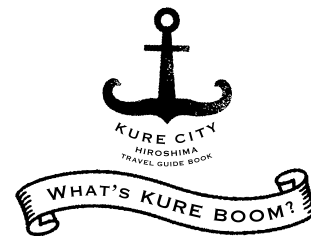
The layout of the Hojo House is reproduced with off-color interlocking and concrete. An information board with a design provided by Fumiyo Kono and a stool decorated with a commissioned design are set up here.

【Suzu's House (Model)】

- At Kure Station Bus Terminal, take the "Tatsukawa Line." Get off at the "Tatsukawa bus stop" and walk for 10 minutes. (There is no parking lot nearby.)

Seto Inland Sea has its own healing view where beautiful islands are located.

Mt. Noro, part of the Setonaikai National Park, is the spot in which the Kawajiri and Yasuura area takes pride in. For the Setonaikai National Park, the mountain is 839 m high, the second highest next to Mt. Rokko in Kobe. After taking in the beautiful view of a group of the islands, you will enjoy your stay to the fullest.



KAWAJIRI & YASUURA AREA

Noro Kogen Lodge

This is an ideal place to enjoy food from Mt. Noro. Specialty dishes including wild boar hotpot and dishes that use seasonal ingredients are served.

You can also view the group of islands connected by Akinada Bridge and Kamagari Bridge from Hachimaki Viewing Platform (mountainside), Kabuto Rock Viewing Platform (mountaintop), and Hoshi Furu Viewing Platform (mountaintop).

Sazanami Skyline

A main road toward Mt. Noro. You can enjoy seasonal landscapes such as a row of cherry trees, colorful autumn leaves, as well as the scenery of beautiful islands in Seto Inland Sea.

Yasuura Museum of History and Folklore (Kunzo Minami Memorial Hall)

The home and the atelier of the master of Western-style paintings of modern Japan, the great painter Kunzo Minami, has been renovated. His works as well as items he regularly used are displayed here. The main house, which is assumed to have been built in the late Edo Era, is extremely valuable for learning about the architectural style of the time.

Shotoen Museum



Shotoen's buildings include Gochiso Ichibankan, where materials related to Korean envoys are displayed, Akarino Yakata, where lighting equipment from all over the world is displayed, and Tojikikan, where domestic and foreign ceramic works are displayed.

“AKINADA TOBISHIMA KAIDO” AREA

Have a leisurely tour of the seven islands in the Akinada Tobishima Sea Route.



You can drive from Akinada Bridge at a relaxed pace while enjoying the scenery through the windows.

Sometimes, you can go cycling while feeling the comforting sea breeze.

Please have a calm and leisurely time while crossing the seven bridges from one island to another.



A Must-see! Picture scroll registered as a UNESCO Memory of the World.

One of the documents on display is a picture scroll depicting Korean envoys dispatched from the Korean Dynasty in 1748 and their fleet sailing through the Inland Sea.

As a valuable historical record that promoted exchange among different ethnic groups, it has been registered as a UNESCO Memory of the World.

Rantokaku Art Museum and Hakusetsuro

Within a tranquil yet magnificent atmosphere created by Japanese architecture, works depicting the beauty of the Seto Inland Sea (sea, pine, etc.) are on display. You can also see works by artists who have a close connection to this island.

After enjoying these works, you can visit a Japanese-style room in Hakusetsuro which serves powdered green tea and has a mysterious feature called “dondengaeshi” – a revolving door that reveals a hidden passage.

Hiroshima Prefectural Beach



This complex resort area provides natural experiences including a beautiful beach selected as one of Japan's best 100 beaches. You can also enjoy various activities such as stargazing at the astronomical observatory with one of the largest Maksutov type telescopes in Hiroshima Prefecture without being prevented by city lights, marine sports like kayaking, or ancient seaweed salt-making. After these activities, you can relax at the natural radon hot spring facility, Yasuragi no Yakata.

There is a lot to experience here, from strawberry and citrus picking, dyeing, crafts, ceramic art to trying herb tea at the herb workshop.

The cycling course on the Akinada Tobishima Sea Route has few ups and downs and less traffic, allowing even beginners to fully enjoy cycling.

There is only one traffic light (Mitoshiro, Shimo-kamagari Island). Refresh yourself by cycling at your own pace while viewing the beautiful islands and feeling the comforting sea breeze in Setouchi.

Kamagari Hot Springs Yasuragi no Yakata

This natural radon hot spring facility offers different kinds of interesting baths including a sauna, herbal medicine bath, jacuzzi, and a whole-body bath using low-frequency electric current. The view of the Akinada Sea is magnificent.

Kamagari Ancient Salt-Making Remains Restoration Exhibition Hall

An exhibition hall that has been restored so you can see the ancient earthenware salt remains just as they were when they were excavated. From the surrounding area, salt-making earthenware from the 5th century was unearthed.

Mitarai Townscape

Mitarai flourished as a town known for its favorable winds and rising tides in which Kitamae-Bune Stopped at. In the town, many buildings and historic sites still retain vestiges of the mid to end of the Edo period, such as small and large merchant houses, tea houses, sailors' inns, shrines and temples, which create a unique atmosphere. In 1994, the Mitarai District was designated as an Important Preservation District for Groups of Historic Buildings.

Hill Overlooking History Park

A park that is set on a high hill that overlooks the Mitarai District. In addition to being able to see a sweeping view of Mitarai, the Kurushima Channel Mt. Ishizuchi and other mountains in Shikoku, you can enjoy a taste of each of the four seasons by passing through the mikan orange fields.

Mikan Museum

The museum introduces the history of mikan orange growing in Yutakamachi, and the passion and care that past growers dedicated to mikan oranges. You can see exhibits such as life-sized replicas of the eight main citrus fruits grown in Yutakamachi, and a model diorama representing Ocho District in around 1965.

Red-Throated Divers Exhibition Room

Fishing using red-throated divers is a traditional fishing method in Toyohama, which boasts 300 years of history. It exhibits a very rare fishing method in the world, in which all of red-throated divers, fishermen, and juveniles work together to fish sea breams and Japanese sea bass.

Tenmangu Shrine



On the grounds of the shrine, there is a well from which the name Mitarai (literal meaning: washing hands) originated, as

Michizane Sugawara (a court scholar, poet, and prominent political figure) is said to have washed his hands with the water from this well. It is also said that practicing calligraphy at the beginning of the year using water from this well will make you intelligent. There is also a monument of Harukichi Nakamura, who achieved "a round-the-world trip with a bicycle" for the first time as a Japanese person in the Meiji period.

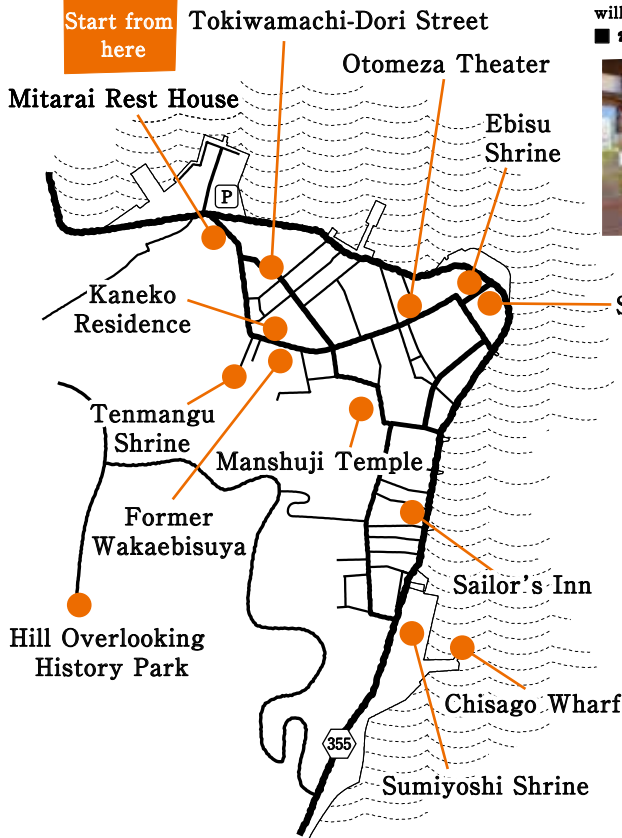
Former Kaneko Residence

A document states that a military agreement (Mitarai Treaty) was concluded here between Choshu Domain and Hiroshima Domain to overthrow the Shogunate.



This building is quite important for us to learn about the connection between Mitarai and Hiroshima Domain.

It is said that Ryoma Sakamoto and Shintaro Nakaoka also visited this residence.



Mitarai Shichikyoochi Ruins

Manshuji Temple

This temple is dedicated to the Buddhist deity of Mercy who is said to have saved the life of Kiyomori Taira. On the grounds of the temple, there is also a Jizo statue for health, which is said to have the power to answer prayers.

Former Wakaebisuya

The largest tea house in Mitarai where courtesans provided services during the Edo period when Mitarai Port flourished. (Prefectural historical site)



Chisago Wharf



A breakwater constructed in 1828. A turtle and a crane are carved at the base of the breakwater in the hope that the port would prosper for tens of thousands of years. It is said that if you rub the turtle and crane, your wishes for eternal youth and immortality will come true.

Sumiyoshi Shrine



If you cross the stone arched bridge beside the tall stone lantern, you will come to Sumiyoshi Shrine, which is dedicated to the god of maritime transport business.

The main hall of the shrine is constructed in Sumiyoshi-zukuri style, which is rare in Japan nowadays. Visitors can enjoy cherry blossoms which bloom in spring on the grounds of the shrine. (Prefectural Important Cultural Property)

Otomeza Theater

This theater was used as a drama or movie theater until around the 1960s, and later turned into a plant for sorting Ocho mikan oranges. It has been restored as a theater and is used for showing popular dramas and movies.



Mitarai Shichikyoochi Ruins

This is the building where Sanetomi Sanjo, known for his role during the Meiji Restoration, is said to have stopped on his way to Choshu. (Prefectural historical site)



Ebisu Shrine



A shrine dedicated to Ebisu, the god of prosperity in business. Only the torii is standing facing the sea. The approach to the main hall from the torii is separated by a prefectural road. (Prefectural Important Cultural Property)



Tokiwamachi-Dori Street

Legend has it that Kiyomori Taira, as the sun was about to set, waved his fan, forcing it to rise again long enough for excavation to be completed.

Three red arched Ondo bridges are the most attractive features of this small port town.

This area is filled with attractive spots such as a beautiful contrast among seasonal flowers, bridges, the sea, as well as historical sites concerning Kiyomori Taira.



ONDO AREA

Ondo no Seto waterway

Legend has it that Kiyomori Taira opened up this waterway in one day.

In the vicinity of the waterway, there are many interesting and beautiful spots such as Kiyomorzuka (a memorial for Kiyomori Taira), Ondo no Seto Park, the Eiji Yoshikawa literary monument, Takagarasudai, and the Himaneki Statue.

From a pedestrian bridge, No.3 Ondo Bridge, which was built along with the opening of the No.2. Ondo Bridge, you can enjoy the spectacular views of the Ondo no Seto waterway and Kure Bay.

Ondo Tourism & Culture Center "Uzushio"



You can experience the unique culture of Ondo with its Ondo Kiyomori Festival, held once every five years, as well as the Ondo Boating Song, one of Japan's Three Great Boating Songs. From the café and deck within the Center, you can see up close the small and large ships that come and go through the Ondo Strait. This spot provides visitors with an excellent view of the Ondo Strait.

3rd Ondo Bridge

From the "3rd Ondo Bridge," which has the same crimson arch bridge form as the "Ondo Bridge" and the "2nd Ondo Bridge," you can get a sweeping view of the Seto area in Ondo.

There are a parking lot, restrooms, and wheelchair ramp set up here, so please enjoy a stroll when you come to the Seto area in Ondo.

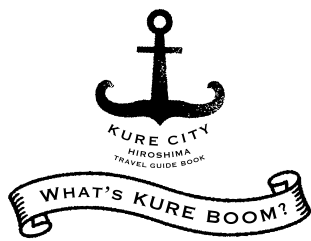


Ondo Townscape

Entering a street from the National Route, you can find townscapes that still retain vestiges of the Showa period.

KURAHASHI AREA

This is a scenic place featuring beautiful beaches and romantic shipbuilding traditions as depicted in Japanese Manyoshu poetry.

Walk a little further from Ondo Area to Kurahashi Area.

There you will find people living with the sea from ancient times, a history of shipbuilding, and a valuable natural beauty that is never changed by time.



Mt. Hiyama

From Ooiwa (big rock) at the summit of Mt. Hiyama, you can take in a breathtaking 360-degree view over the inland sea as far as the Shikoku mountain range. On a clear day, you can see both Shikoku Mountains and Yamaguchi in the same view.

- At Kure Station Bus Terminal, take the "Kure Kurahashijima Line" bus. Get off at "Hiyama Tozanguchi" and walk one hour and 40 minutes.

Nagato Shipbuilding History Museum

Many shipbuilding and marine transportation models including ancient and modern wooden ships are on display here. At the center of the museum, a reconstructed Kentoshi Ship (used to take Japanese envoys to Tang Dynasty of China more than 1,200 years ago) is displayed.

Katsuragahama Beach

Kurahashi was formerly called Nagato Island. From old times it was an important point for sea transport in the Seto Inland Sea. Kurahashi prospered due to ship manufacturing and the navy. From ancient times through the Nara Era, there are records of boats being made here for overseas missions. It has white sand, blue seas and green pine forests. This beach was chosen as one of the 100 best beaches and shores in Japan. It has expansive scenery that is as beautiful now as it was in the past.

Natural Hot Springs Katsuragahama Hot Springs Facility

Located across from the beach, these hot spring baths are rich in sodium chloride, and effective for treating 24 different ailments.

【Hoso Udon (thin udon noodles)】



Hoso Udon has soft, thin noodles that require a short boiling time. It was loved by busy workers at a former naval arsenal as a quick meal.

【Kure Reimen (cold noodles)】



Kure Reimen has flat noodles and is served in a sweet, sour and spicy soup. It has been a favorite with the locals as a soul food.

【Kure Maritime

Self-Defense Force Curry】



This curry reproduces the taste of the curry eaten by the people who belong to the naval vessels of the Maritime Self-Defense Force Kure base. You can taste it at restaurants in the city.

【Chirimen (Baby Sardines)】



These dried and seasoned baby sardines are caught in the surrounding sea. Chirimen are all-natural without bleaching and are famous nationwide.



【Oysters】

Kure produces the most oysters in Japan! Each area holds its own oyster festival in the winter season. Large oysters with the rich smell of the beach will make you eager to try delicious local foods.

【Ocho Mikan (Mandarin Orange)】



The "Ocho Mikan" in Yutaka and Toyohama is a nationally recognized variety. It's known for its refreshing, sweet, and rich taste.

【Otakara (Treasure) Tomato】

Another name for tomatoes harvested in winter and spring. The "Otakara Tomato" in Kurahashi is characterized by its deep taste, rich red color, and firm texture.



【Lemon】

Kure City boasts the largest volume of lemons shipped in Japan. Among areas in Kure, Yutaka is the birthplace of Hiroshima-made lemons. They are cultivated with safety in mind, so you can eat them with the skin on.
